The Pastor Ponders...

...How Can We Be Good Stewards of God's Creation?

The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it.

(Psalm 24: 1)

Last Sunday, I was talking with a couple of folks and we were reminiscing about growing up in the McHenry/ Ringwood/ Wonder Lake/ Hebron/Wisconsin area and how most of the space was wide open back then. When I was serving churches in the burbs, I used to enjoy driving out this way to visit friends or up to Wisconsin to visit our daughter, especially when the sight of freshly tilled fields or the fragrance of manure announced the official arrival of Spring. Instead, I am saddened by the fact that many of the formerly wide open spaces are now festooned with the evidence that they are not about to be wide open any longer. Subdivision signs and stakes with fluorescent pink, yellow, and orange flags dot the landscape. Front loaders, bulldozers, and dump trucks sit at the ready. RMN Working Group - Reasons to Reconcile

Reconciling Ministries Network is a network of United Methodist churches and groups who have been working for the past 36 years to seek justice for people of all sexual orientations and gender identities. Here at HUMC we have put together a committee, the RMN Working Group, to explore and lead HUMC through the steps for joining the RMN. As promised in last month's article, we will be providing the "Top 10 Reasons to Affiliate with Reconciling Ministries," starting with the first three reasons below:

- 1. Extend God's fully inclusive love and unconditional welcome inviting LGBTQ people into affirming spaces in which all can worship, serve, and find a faith community.
- 2. Challenge the default that the UMC is anti-LGBTQ and clarify the position of our ministry. Make our position clear on LGBTQ justice and inclusion set apart from the denomination as a whole.
- 3. Help our current neighbors, new residents, and out of town guests find us. RMN connects people and churches. Being listed in the RMN registry of inclusive churches is important. It allows prospective visitors to find Reconciling Churches and Communities by state and is widely used. Because of the harm the institutional Church has done to LGBTQ persons, *visiting a church is a risk that requires courage*. No matter how welcoming and affirming a church may be on the inside, LGBTQ friends will never experience that affirmation if it's not first expressed through an intentional, outward invitation. We place our welcome mats on the outside of the building, not just the inside.


