The Pastor Ponders...

...What will they hear?

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them.

Acts 16: 25

I was scrolling through some of the blurbs on the internet when I ran across an article that said Kate Middleton uses Chat Sofa to discipline royal kids. Well, I just couldn't pass that up. According to the article, when the young princes and princess are misbehaving, Kate sends them to the "chat sofa" rather than the "naughty step," (which I assume is the equivalent of "time out") in order to help them learn the rules. While they are there. Kate or William has a quiet chat with them to explain the rules, and the consequences of their behavior. At no time are the children allowed to shout at each other, and neither Kate, nor William, nor their nanny shout at the children either. According to sources, the adults are good at listening to the children, as well as very firm in their discipline techniques, but also gentle and quiet. And the children, for the most part, are well-behaved.

wanted to get my point across, and I have been tempted to say something unkind, to lash out in a loud voice, to gesture wildly, to put the other person in their place. After all, I am big, I have power. It usually guaranteed that I'd get my way. I rationalized that I was in the heat of the moment, so how was I supposed to have control? Nevertheless, that did not make shouting and criticism OK.

My mother was a huge proponent of the "count to 10" philosophy of confrontation. She also admonished us over and over again that we should treat others as we wish to be treated, and that applied to our verbal interactions as well. She taught that there are ways of getting our point across without shouting, name-calling, and using expletives, ways that encourage us to speak words which honor the dignity of others while acknowledging our differences, ways that encourage discussion and dialogue and not quarrels and arguments.

These days, I am finding that folks think that loud and aggressive behavior is more the norm than the exception, but that still doesn't make it right.

Tertullian, an ancient theologian who converted to Christianity, observed the difference between the pagan society and Christianity. He said, "Look how those Christians love one another." The refrain of a well-known hymn says, "They'll know we are Christians by our love."

People around us are listening to us and watching what we do. What are we saying about Jesus Christ in our verbal interactions? What are we saying about the worth of the people around us? The words we use, the tone we use, the volume we use can either escalate a volatile situation or deescalate it. My grandchildren have been referring to me as the "Nana who doesn't yell." I'll admit to taking a certain amount of pride in that. I'll also admit that it has challenged me to be much more careful about what I am going to say and how. And, yes, I am happy to report that my grandkids are pretty aware of the rules and the consequences, and yelling isn't desirable.

Paul and Silas had had a real bummer of a day before they ended up in prison. And, yet, they found the ability to sing and praise God and so many were converted by their words. What a challenge!



An A1C test is a blood analysis that measures the average glucose level in the blood for the last 3 months. A1C tests can be used to diagnose diabetes and prediabetes. An A1C test is also the main test used to in the management of diabetes.

No Fasting Needed





Risk Test for Prediabetes

- If you are a woman, at one time, were you diagnosed with gestational diabetes?
- 2. Do you have a mother, father, brother or sister with diabetes?
- 3. Have you ever been diagnosed with high blood pressure?
- 4. Have you ever been told you have diabetes or prediabetes?

If you responded YES to any of these questions, you may benefit from an A1C screening!

HELP IMMIGRANTS ARRIVING FROM TEXAS

More than 750 asylum seekers from Central and South America have arrived on buses sent from Texas since Aug. 31, according to the city of Chicago. In collaboration with local, state, and federal agencies, the city of Chicago is taking action to ensure they have access to shelter, food, and other resources.

The city expects to receive hundreds more migrants from Texas. Under the direction of Governor Greg Abbott, the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), and the Texas National Guard, the Lone Star state has also bused over 8,000 migrants to the nation's capital since April and over 2,200 migrants to New

York City since August 5, according to the state's website.



Lay Missioners Roberto Moreno and Jackie Moreno Salgado who serve Living Waters NFC in Franklin Park bring donations to dozens of immigrant families štaying in a suburban hotel in Burr Ridge.

Individuals and families are housed in temporary Chicago shelters and hotels in nearby suburbs.

Immediate donation needs include:

- · Small size clothing (especially socks and underwear/sports bras)
- · First Aid kits (Band-aids, Bandages, etc)
- · Medications for adults and children (e.g. Ibuprofen, Acetaminophen, etc)
- Personal Hygiene items (toiletries, feminine products, etc)
- Duffle Bags/Small Suitcases
