The Pastor Ponders...

...When was the last time you just praised the Lord?

Let everything that breathes praise the Lord! Psalm 150:6

Following our ordination as Elder, Bishop Sprague invited our class to a preaching retreat with him. He suggested that we might find it helpful to keep a small notebook with us at all times in which we could write down some random thoughts, quotes, or other sayings that we might find helpful when it came time to preparing future sermons, newsletter articles, and the like. Nowadays, most clergy probably keep this stuff on their phones or tablets. I keep it on little pieces of paper scattered all over my desk.

Today I ran across a snippet from some old Church School material that I cut and taped to a piece of paper. "This is our story, the story of God's people whose very purpose is to *praise God*." (italics mine) I'm not so sure that I have thought of that as my primary purpose for being for a while. I have a tendency to get caught up in evangelism – my task is to share God's forgiveness, (continued on page 2)

acceptance, and love with others. Or sometimes I focus on the purpose of the church - to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Or it may be the direction in Matthew 25 to feed the hungry, visit the sick and imprisoned, and so forth. But praise, hmmm, when was the last time that I intentionally took that as my *primary* purpose of being? How about you?

The Bible is filled with examples and admonitions to praise God. Psalm 113 instructs us to praise the name of the Lord all day long, from today until the end of time. Psalm 100 tells us to praise God because it is God that made us and we are God's possession. Psalm 115 talks about the fact that God has mighty power far above all other gods and yet, God also sees us, hears us, cares for us, and can be trusted by us, therefore God is due our praise. The Psalms go on to talk about praising God with prayers, and singing, and dancing, and instrumental music, with arms outstretched or heads and hearts bowed. Deuteronomy 10:21 says, "God is your praise; God is your God, who has done for you these great and awesome things that your own eyes have seen." An aid to prayers suggests that we use the acronym ACTS to help us decide what to pray about - Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication.

Jesus said the greatest commandment is to love God (and then to love others). "Well, if praising God is my primary purpose in life," I thought, "then I better get busy and do it." Last week as we drove to North Carolina and spent many hours in the mountains, I marveled at all the iridescent colors of the trees, smelled the earthy smells of fallen leaves, listened to the sounds babbling brooks and birds chirping, and felt the gentle autumn breeze as the sun started to set. Every now and then I could hear the sounds of cars whooshing down the road, and folks calling out to one another. What an amazing and complex world our Creator has created! What an awesome God God is! Praise the Lord! What was even more miraculous was the way in which my perspective shifts when I engage in a period of praise. I am not alone in my observation. The psalmist captured my feeling exactly in Psalm 8. What a difference practicing our primary purpose of life can make. What a change pausing to praise can effect.

of popcorn for each family, as we've done in the past. God bless all of you and may you have a meaningful Thanksgiving.




