The Pastor Ponders...

...What Is Intercessory Prayer?"

Therefore Jesus is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.

Hebrews 7: 25 NIV

Intercessory prayer is a type of prayer whereby we pray to God on behalf of another person or group. Often we pray for healing, guidance, discernment, or for a particular situation that we would like God to address. In other words, we act as a mediator or intercessor on behalf of others. In the Bible, the apostle Paul asked his friends to pray for him that God would help him and that they all might be blessed. (2 Corinthians 1: 11) In John 17 Jesus prays for himself, for his disciples, and for all who would believe in him in the future – us! On Sunday morning when we pray for our joys and concerns, we are practicing intercessory prayer.

In *The Workbook of Intercessory Prayer*, Maxie Dunnam wrote, "we can't think very long about prayer without thinking about intercessory prayer. We can't pray very long or very often without our minds and hearts turning from our own needs and our own relationship with God to others and their needs." He went on to admit that, even though he studied and practiced intercessory prayer, he never quite understood it. And, as he struggled with



making meaning of this form of prayer, he began to ask the questions: What difference does it make? Does it make a difference? And how does it make a difference?

I've been reading Francis MacNutt's book *Healing* in preparation for our Productive Aging class. MacNutt reports that a group of priests got together regularly to intercede for a group of folks and their community. They prayed not only for the healing of body, emotions, and spirits of individuals, but also for the healing of the community, especially concerning its political, economic, and spiritual well-being. They discovered that intercessory prayer did make a difference. As individuals became healthier, so did their relationships. They stopped acting towards others out of their hurt and prejudices which divide and began helping others to heal and build community. The community underwent a transformation where there was less injustice and oppression and more value and appreciation of each other. Overall, there was a return to the spiritual necessity of relationship with Jesus Christ and a knowledge that humans can't fix everything on their own – they need the Holy Spirit. Conversely, God needs the partnership of humans if society is to realize a change for the better.

Intercessory prayer moves our thoughts and actions beyond our own needs and desires to a focus on the concerns of others and the ability of God to act in a positive way to make a change. To that end, I invite us to practice intercessory pray on a daily basis for those we care about and for our country. I found this prayer on the Campus Crusade website. (This is *not* an endorsement of Campus Crusade. I chose the prayer because it was short and simple and conveyed a desire for transformation.) Lord, please be in our midst as we come together as your body to lift up our country and our leaders. Please protect our country from the division that challenges our ability to live lives pleasing to you. Defend the vulnerable and voiceless, and bring justice to those who have suffered injustice. Realign and unify your people in Your Son, Jesus Christ, who is the author and protector of our faith, as we cry out to you for our land. Amen.


